FOREWORD


Lynchburg College began its golden anniversary celebration April 17 by remembering the handful of pioneer churchmen and educators who came to Lynchburg fifty years ago to found a Christian College.


In 1903 Dr. Hopwood, founder and president of Milligan College, Tenn., received a letter from his former pupil, the Rev. F. F. Bullard, concerning the location and possible sale of Westover Hotel. In mid-April Dr. Hopwood and a small group of friends, finding the location suitable, decided to purchase Westover Hotel as a basic unit for the college, chartered in 1903 as Virginia Christian College.

During the following summer, extensive innovations in the physical layout of the building were made to adapt it to the needs of the student body of V.C.C.

Dr. Hopwood reported, "Changes in the basement were made first. The saloon was converted into kitchen, storeroom and dining hall. On the first floor the elegant dance hall was changed into a Chapel. One-half of the space on the first floor

furnished abundant classrooms, parlors and reception halls. The girls went up the elegant stairway at one end of the hall, the young men at the other. A partition was put in the center of the large hallway on the second floor. The teachers' rooms were placed near the center of the building. By this time the house was comfortable, convenient, and all seemed one great happy family."

September, 1903, found ten teachers and 155 students on hand for the opening session of the college. Eight students graduated in 1904. Board, room and tuition were sixteen dollars per month for students who came "in search of industrial, moral, mental, physical and spiritual training and education for young white persons of both sexes."

After Dr. Hopwood's resignation in 1910, a debt crisis arose and the total enrollment of V.C.C. dropped to 45 students. In 1911, Dr. S.T. Willis was named second president. He resigned the following year to be followed by Dr. G. O. Davis. Then Dr. G. P. Coler, vice president, took over the reins of administration in June, 1914, but he died in April, 1915.


In 1914, Dr. J. T. T. Hundley became the school's financial representative. In June, 1915, he was named fourth president, and with indomitable courage led the college through one of its blackest periods.

The name "Lynchburg College" was adopted in 1919 as the church area served by the college was enlarged to include Maryland, District of Columbia, and Florida.

Through the efforts of Dr. Hundley and Dr. Riley B. Montgomery, who succeeded him in 1936, expansion of facilities was continued, academic program was improved, honor system was inaugurated, and the guidance program broadened.


During the administration of Dr. Montgomery, the large debt which had accumulated during the depression was liquidated, and the enrollment reached a peak of 741 students.

In 1949, Dr. Orville W. Wake, current president, succeeded Dr. Montgomery. Under his able leadership, Lynchburg College has launched a curriculum study





Burnette led the scoring with 303 points and also the foul shooting with a 72.4 average. He was followed by Mitchell with 249 points.


The college will suffer a loss due to the graduation of both the cocaptains and the two senior men. Next year's team will miss their fighting spirit on the basketball court.


The Baby Hornets completed an impressive season under the direction of their new coach, Rut Moon. They won 9 games and lost 7.


