College Lake Work Progressing Rapidly

Scenic Body of Water to Be Mile and Half Long; Draws Visitors

The artificial lake, formed by the state highway, which runs on the north side of the campus, is becoming a very attractive spot and is drawing many visitors.

Work was begun in the fall of 1934 and has progressed rapidly since the plans were completed.

Under the original plans, the lake will be more than ten feet below the roadway at its lowest point. If, however, flash boards are put up as contemplated, the level of the lake will be greatly raised, but not enough to cause any danger in time of flood. The flash boards will probably raise the lake level five feet.

The spillway will be sixty feet long, and have a clearance of fifteen feet, which is sufficient to carry a large volume of water in times of floods.

The lake proper will be about a mile and a half long, but will be very narrow in parts, although sufficiently wide enough to make it a very attractive body of water.

The landscaping of the lake will be supervised by Mr. Neal of the Virginia Highway Department.

The lake will be one of natural scenic beauty and a great improvement to the campus.

It is expected that the lake will be filled this winter, which will give the students of the college a place to swim and enjoy water sports in the spring.
